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
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*Abstract*

The bibliography lists 907 published references on marine and estuarine studies, other than physical oceanography, in Western Australia. They are indexed by subject and author.

## Introduction

Western Australia has a long coastline, extending between about 14° and 35°S, bounded to the west and north by a wide continental shelf. The waters of the coast encompass many ecosystems and habitats. While observations of parts of this extensive coastline have been recorded from the time of the Dutch navigators in the 17th century, marine research and the recording of the diverse habitats have their foundations in the early 19th century. Scientific investigations of coastal marine Western Australia have intensified over the last sixty years, with more coherent and collaborative studies being carried out during the last two decades.

The long history of coastal marine science in Western Australia ensured that the published records were widely dispersed in scientific journals and the reports of learned societies. The recent growth of multidisciplinary studies further increased the number of journals in which findings are published.

In discussions of the Western Australian Branch of the Australian Marine Sciences Association, scientists and students frequently spoke of the difficulty of identifying and locating literature relevant to the Western Australian habitats in which they were working. This bib-

liography of selected marine and estuarine studies (other than physical oceanography) is an attempt to answer their needs. It is a companion volume to A. Pearce 1983, A Bibliography of Physical Oceanography in Southwest Australian Waters, CSIRO Marine Laboratories Report 157, and to an earlier bibliography on estuaries and embayments (Hodgkin and Majer, 1976, ref. 376).

In this bibliography, we have listed a selection of published work in marine coastal biology and geology from 1930, together with several earlier references that we consider important for geographical description or taxonomy. We have not included unpublished reports, many of the most recent of which are available from State government departments and environmental consultants.

The marine science community in Western Australia has assisted us generously with the preparation of this bibliography. We are particularly grateful to Miriam Bezant and Jan Marshall of the Western Australian Museum for help in preparing the citations and indexes, and to Jill Thomas of the CSIRO Marine Laboratories in Perth for typing the manuscript.

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
